I. What is "sociological immortality"?

Biology of immortality is a question of relational biological science. Social immortality is not the biological immortality of individuals, but the fact that people in a society do not die for social reasons, and this society can be stable, prosperous, intergenerational, and not self-destructing, and people live longer, happier and better lives. New York's legal system and government work have the goal and requirement of social immortality for all New Yorkers.

A truly "sociologically immortal" society must have the following characteristics:

- Productivity is well developed and society is wealthy
- There is no structural poverty
- No one is bankrupted or died because their illness is not treated in a realistic society.
- There is no institutional incentive for crime
- No insurmountable survival difficulties and homelessness
- There is no "use not pay" civilization backwards
- Ensure the inalienable right of every person to work and that production, labour, credit and dignity are sustainable for generations

The problem in New York is not "not rich enough," but systemic disorder

New York is one of the richest regions in the world, but the reality is:

- Productivity is not well developed
- Poverty and income stagnation coexist
- Chaos in security order
- The hollowing out of manufacturing
- Medical costs become a major reason why some residents are in trouble
- Tenants, rent arrears, and contract failures become the norm
- Law breakers, contract breakers and laborers are penalized
- Many unreasonable laws and regulations in place shorten the sociological life of the population

This is not an economic problem, but a sign that the social fabric is no longer able to repair itself.

III. Core judgments

One cannot guarantee basic survival,
We cannot guarantee basic security and order,
We cannot uphold the basic contract,
Work and law-abiding societies cannot be rewarded,
It cannot last for a long time.

New York must move from a "temporary patch policy" to a structural, fundamental institutional reconstruction.

IV. The institutional path to a "sociological immortality" in New York

Comprehensive, closed-loop, sustainable social reconstruction programmes:



Universal basic income (UBI)

- Guarantee the basic right to life of every person
- Ensuring that everyone has at least a basic income and eliminating poverty
- Cut off the economic motive for crime



Free health insurance for all

- Being sick guarantees proper treatment
- Returning health care to public security, not financial plunder



Restoring the civilized bottom line of "spending must be paid"

- Money must be exchanged for shopping
- You must pay for food to eat
- Rent must be paid for renting
- Default of rent = Contract breach
- End renters and restore credit and contractual order



Reviving New York Manufacturing and Infrastructure

- Manufacturing is the material basis of social survival
- Reducing systemic costs and restoring employment and productive capacity



Six "zero" social goals

- Zero poverty
- Zero crime
- Zero unemployment
- Zero Travellers
- Zero discrimination
- Zero Renters

Why is this "sociological immortality" rather than a slogan?

Because this is not a short-term handout, but:

- Permanent survival with UBI + Medicare
- Use contracts and laws to guarantee order, safety and the right to work
- Securing the needs and future of society through manufacturing and labor
- Use institutional rather than moral persuasion to solve problems

This is a social structure that can be extended from generation to generation.

VI. Objectives of the Seminar
